

FROM THE TRANSITIONAL PASTOR:



Want to use the church building for a party or some other event? Need a place for the scouts to have an event? Planning a wedding?

The Trustees have established a new policy that <u>anyone</u> using the building for something other than a church event MUST fill out a building use form. You can pick one up from the church office and return it to Missy when it is completed.

This is important because we are trying to do a better job scheduling events so that there aren't so many things happening on the same day. The sooner you fill out a building use form, the sooner Missy can add it to the church calendar so that someone else doesn't expect to use the building on the same day.

There is no fee for church members. So why do members need to fill this out? Well, there are several reasons:

- The Trustees tried to get a grant a few years ago for air conditioning but were denied because they couldn't prove the need for using the building on the part of the community, which would include your building use for things other than church events.
- This will aid the church office in knowing what is happening in our building when the office is not open. For insurance purposes, we need to prove that we are aware when an outside group or church member is using the facilities in case something happens.
- We need to have contact information in the case that something changes or we need to check on timing of events.

Please aid us in coordinating the use of the church building, rather than assuming it will be available. We are a very busy congregation and something might already be planned on the day you desire to use the building.





ADULT LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES



On January 5th scholarship applications for the Hartmann & Crothers Scholarships will be made available. Applications and transcripts must include your 1st semester senior year grades.

The Hartmann Scholarship will be awarded to a senior at Midlakes who intends to earn a baccalaureate degree. The Crothers Scholarship will be awarded to a senior of an area high school who will be attending an accredited institution of higher learning.

To be eligible for either scholarship the senior must be an active member of the United Church of Phelps. The actual award will be made after the successful completion of the first semester of college; awardee will furnish an official transcript bearing the seal of the college or university to the church office.



Sunday, January 5th - Epiphany of the Lord

WHAT IS THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD?

The Epiphany of our Lord is the wonderful liturgical festival observed the first Sunday in January. Epiphany is also the season that lasts until the beginning of Lent and encompasses four to nine Sundays, depending on the date of Easter.

WHAT DOES THE CHURCH COMMEMORATE DURING EPIPHANY?

The Festival of the Epiphany of our Lord originally commemorated three incidents that manifested the mission and divinity of Christ: the visit of the Magi (Matthew 2:1-12), the baptism of Jesus (Mark 1:9-11), and the miracle at Cana (John 2:1-11). Nowadays, most churches emphasize the visit of the Magi (the Wisemen).

"Gifts of the Heart Health Kits"

{Band-aids, hand towels and toothpaste ARE NEEDED to complete kits!!}

Kit Items:

One hand towel, one washcloth, one comb, one metal nail file/nail clipper, one bar of soap (bath size), one toothbrush, one tube of toothpaste (4-7 ounces), six band-aids

** Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure and bring them to the church office. **

On-Going Mission Projects Everyone Can Support:

- * 1st Sunday of each month: Food Pantry Sunday. Donations should be placed on the altar
- * **Pop Top Tabs:** Save those tabs! If your place of work has a vending machine set out a container for people to put them in. Let's help out the Ronald McDonald House!
- * **NYC Sock Mission:** Please keep the socks, mittens and winter hats coming! This is a great mission we do and it's on-going. When we have enough we ship them out!
- * Red Bird Mission: Please keep box tops coming in! We are amazed at how much good they really do.
- * Medicine Bottle Collection: Save up a group of your containers, peel the label off and wash them in warm soapy water. If label is stubborn, soak them in Oxi-clean detergent and hot water until you are able to easily remove the labels, and the glue. Then bring them into church and put them in the container Matthew 25 Ministries.
